On Wednesday, April 5th, **Detective Jeff Burbank** received a tip that **Alejandro Capouch**, 28, had been seen entering a Faribault residence. Capouch, the subject of several arrest warrants, recently led officers on a pursuit through the city to avoid capture. The pursuit had been ended out of safety concerns. **Detectives Matt Kolling, Scott Duncan, Officers Tony Kuchinka, Lisa Petricka, Sergeant Matt**

Knutson, RCSO Sergeant Blaine Smith, Investigator Paul LaRoche and Cannon River Drug and Violent Offender Task Force agents surrounded the residence and called for Capouch to surrender. After officers spoke with a female in the residence, Capouch exited and was taken into custody without incident. Officers also discovered a stolen car from Minneapolis parked at the residence, and it was recovered.

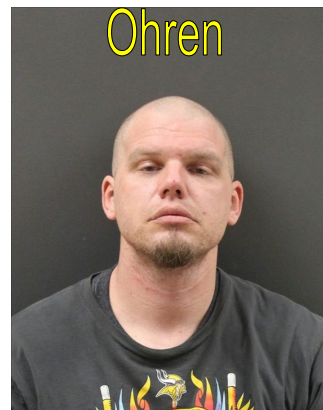

Ohren was jailed and cited for Theft, Driving After Cancellation and Providing False Information to a Peace Officer. He was released on his own recognizance by the court.

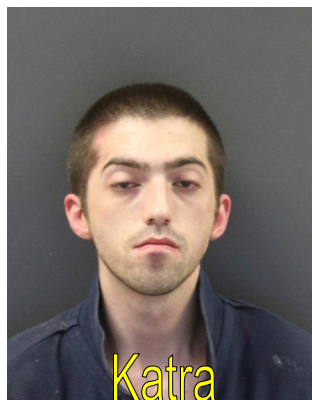

Come Out, Come Out, Wherever You Are

On Tuesday, April 5th, **Detective Jeff Burbank** spotted Teddy Katra, 29, who was the subject of several warrants. Katra, who has a history of attempting to evade law enforcement and not appearing in court, refused to answer the door at his residence. **Detectives Matt Kolling, Scott Duncan, Officers Lisa Petricka, Tony Kuchinka, Mike Thul, Sergeants Matt Knutson, Brandon Gliem, RCSO Investigators Paul LaRoche, Nate Hanson, Deputies Steve Bauer, Jason Witt and Cannon River Drug and Violent Offender**

Task Force agents surrounded and entered the residence. Katra was located hid-



ing in the attic of the residence and taken into custody without incident. In addition, methamphetamine and drug paraphernalia was also found and seized. Officers did not locate his sister, Sara Katra, who is also the subject of several arrest warrants.

This is a problem residence that draws many of our resources. We recognize this is a blight in the neighborhood and work to address issues and hold the residents and their guests accountable for their criminal and/or nuisance behavior.
