

On Wednesday, May 31st, **Officers Tony Larson, Lisa Petricka, Sergeant Matt Knutson** and RCSO **Sergeant Jeff Mullenmeister** responded to a reported garage burglary. The owner stated he believed the suspect may have been in the garage. The owner had also reported a theft from the garage the previous day. Officers opened the garage to find a lone male inside. The owner told officers he did not know who the male was and had not given him permission to be in the

garage. The suspect, Julius McGuire, 21, told officers he was tired and found the garage unlocked, so he went inside to sleep. He denied the earlier theft even though officers found him in possession of a distinctive blanket that had been taken. McGuire was arrested and jailed. He was charged with 3rd degree Burglary, and was released on his own recognizance by the court. Charges for the previously reported theft will be forthcoming.

Wisconsin Fugitive Caught

On Friday, May 26th, **Officer Said Hilowle** observed a vehicle parked behind a local motel. He could see a person who appeared to be trying to hide inside. He noted the vehicle did not have license plates. He met with the lone male occupant who appeared very nervous and could not provide clear answers to questions. **Officers Matt Shuda** and **Josh Alexander** arrived to assist. Ofc. Hilowle attempted to check the name the man provided, but could not verify it was correct. Ofc. Alexander checked the vehicle,

and learned it was reported stolen from Wisconsin. The

male, who finally told officers his real name was Steven Johnson, 45, admitted he had provided his brother's name. The officers also learned that Johnson had absconded from custody in Dunn County, WI and was the subject of an arrest warrant. Three stolen license plates were discovered inside the vehicle. He was arrested and charged with Receiving Stolen Property (two counts) and Providing False Information. His bail was set at \$25,000 with conditions and he was held pending extradition to Wisconsin.

Stuck On an Island

Burger was cited for 3rd degree DWI and 5th degree Controlled Substances. He was released on his own recognizance by the court.

Domestic Assault Arrests


