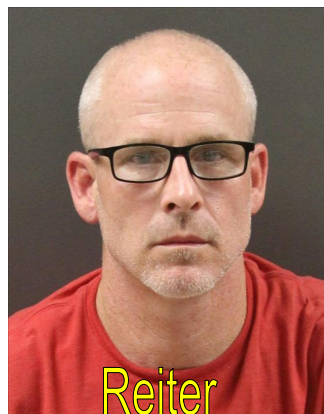

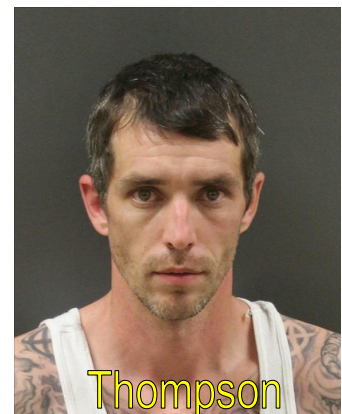


Large Drug Arrest for CRDVOTF

On Thursday, September 14th, **Cannon River Drug and Violent Offender Task Force** agents scored a hit on the local meth trade. After weeks of investigation, the agents, assisted by Northfield, Faribault and Rice County officers, stopped and arrested Joshua Reiter, 43, and Cole Thompson, 37, as the pair returned to Rice County while transporting a large amount of methamphetamine. The duo had been previously identified as sources for meth. Inside their vehicle, agents located one pound of methamphetamine, 112 grams of marijuana, 178 prescription pills, as well as smaller amounts

of both powder and black tar heroin. Both Reiter and Thompson were charged with 1st degree Controlled Substances (sales), 3rd degree Controlled

Substances (possession), and 5th degree Controlled Substances (six counts). Bail was set at \$500,000 each with conditions.

Warm Donation

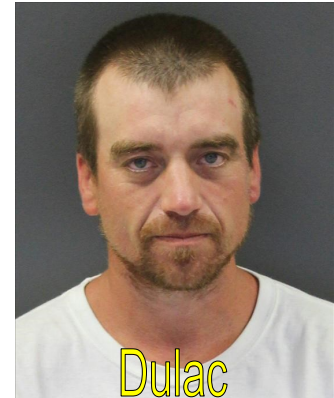

Stalking Arrest

On Friday, September 15th, **Officer Josh Alexander** responded to a reported Harassment restraining Order (HRO) violation. The victim stated she had stopped at the side of the road to make a phone call when the suspect approached her vehicle, knocked on the window and began yelling at her. She was able to drive away and call for help. Ofc. Alexander also spoke with the person who had been speaking with the victim on the phone, who also corroborated the victim's report. In checking records, Ofc. Alexander noted the sus-

pect, Alex Dulac, 39, had been involved in five previous HRO violation reports in the past several months. Officers attempted to locate Dulac at his residence but were unsuccessful. Several hours later, **Officer Keith Voegel** spotted Dulac. **Officers Chris Tonjum, Michael Shuda and Sergeant Mark Krenik** responded to assist, along with Ofc. Alexander. Dulac was arrested and jailed without incident. He was charged with Stalking and HRO Violation (two counts). His bail was set at \$50,000 with conditions. He



was subsequently charged with HRO Violation from an incident in August.

Chairs Are For Sitting

On Saturday, September 16th, **Officers Keith Voegel, Chris Tonjum, Michael Shuda and Sergeant Mark Krenik** responded to a disorderly person. Several witnesses stated they saw a male walking on Central Avenue pick up a chair and throw it at a car, damaging the windshield. The suspect was then seen throwing rocks at vehicles by Faribault firefighters, who notified officers. Ofc. Voegel stopped



the suspect, Abbas Mohamed, 27, outside of the police department with a handful of rocks. He was taken into custody, and, due to statements made to officers, taken to District One for evaluation. He continued to struggle and threaten officers and medical staff. He was jailed and charged with Damage to Property (felony) and his bail was set at \$5,000 with conditions.
