Warrant Watch

This week, we're looking for Jon Brown, He is the subject of three Rice County warrants for failing to appear for jury trials related to charges of predatory registration failure, 3rd degree Controlled Substances, and Introducing Contraband to Jail, Obstructing Legal Process, Giving a Peace Officer a False Name and Disorderly Conduct. Brown is 6'0" tall, weighs 200 pounds, has brown eyes and black hair. Brown is also subject of two Steele County warrants and a Dodge County warrant.

We are also looking for Danielle Foster, 40. She is the subject of an arrest warrant for probation violation for 4th degree DWI and 5th degree Controlled Substances. Foster is 5'6" tall, weighs 130 pounds, has blue eyes and blonde hair. Foster is also the subject of a Goodhue County warrant.

Finally, we're looking for Trevor St. Martin, 38. He is the subject of two warrants for failing to appear for sentencing on charges of 5th degree Controlled

Substances and failing to appear for sentencing on charges of theft, and a third warrant for failing to comply with conditions of the court. St. Martin is 6'1" tall, weighs 180 pounds, has brown eyes and brown hair.

Domestic Assault Arrest

On Wednesday, January 10th, **Officers Ben Johns, Karl Willers** and **Sergeant Matt Long** responded to a reported domestic assault. Ofc. Johns met with the victim, who reported that she had been assaulted by her sister, with whom she lived, following an argument about her sister's alcohol use. The sister became physically assaultive and pulled out the victim's hair. Ofc. Johns could see clumps of the victim's hair on the floor. The suspect also pulled out a butcher knife and swung it at the victim,

causing a small cut to her face, before leaving the residence. Ofc. Willers found the suspect, Jiokea Tut, 24, in the parking lot. Tut denied the assault, and stated she was the one who had been assaulted. Officers also learned that Tut was the subject of an active arrest warrant for trespassing. Tut was arrested and jailed without incident, and then transported to a detox facility. Tut was charged with 2nd degree Assault and Domestic Assault. Her bail was set at \$2,500 with conditions.
