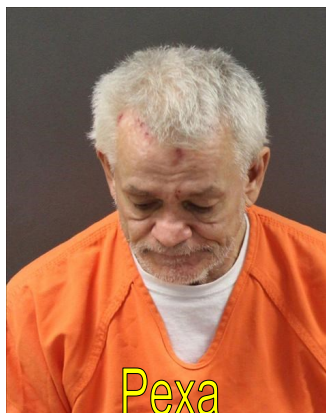

## Checkout Time

On Tuesday, February 6th, **Officers Allen Anderson, Sean Smallen and Michael Shuda** responded to a local motel. Staff reported two persons, who were not registered guests, were not allowing cleaning staff into the room. Officers knocked on the door which was opened by a male know to officers as Wayne Pexa, 61. Pexa attempted to shut the door and struck one of the officers who had grabbed him. Pexa became loud and disorderly when he was removed from the room. When officers entered the room, they encountered Julie Boersma, 47, who was also yelling and uncooperative. Pexa and Boersma were arrested. Both Pexa and Boersma displayed behavior indicating they were under the influence of narcotics. When he was searched, officers found

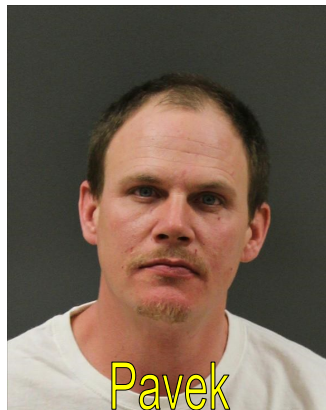
drug paraphernalia and suspected methamphetamine in Pexa's wallet. The substance did test positive for methamphetamine and weighed just over five grams. Pexa and Boersma were jailed. Pexa was charged with 5th degree Controlled Substances, Possession of Drug Paraphernalia, Obstructing Legal

Process and Failure to Furnish Hotel Operator Registration Information. His bail was set at \$15,000 with conditions. Boersma was charged with Failure to Furnish Hotel Operator Registration Information and Obstructing Legal Process. Her bail was set at \$6,000 with conditions.



## Domestic Assault Report

On Monday, February 5th **Officers Michael Shuda, Ben Johns and Sergeant Brandon Gliem** responded to a reported domestic assault. The caller reported her mother had been assaulted by her boyfriend. The caller stated she had heard an assault occurring, and saw her mother with a bloody nose. Officers spoke with the victim, who stated she had been arguing with her boyfriend. She denied an assault had taken



place, despite the fact they could see blood around her nose and a bruise under her eye. Officers also spoke with the suspect, Kenneth Pavek, 40, who admitted to having a disagreement but denied assaulting the victim. Pavek was arrested and jailed. He was cited for Domestic Assault, and released on his own recognizance by the court.

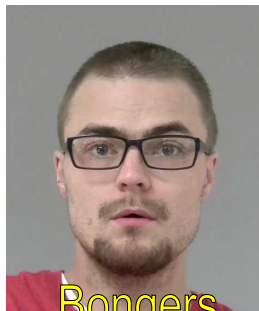
On Saturday, February 3rd, **Officer Adam Marvin** observed a parked vehicle being sought in connection with the theft of a donation box from a local convenience store. He approached the vehicle to identify the occupants. The passenger, who matched the description of the theft suspect, was identified as Angela Herplinck, 35. Ofc. Marvin also learned she was the subject of Steele and Waseca County warrants and placed her under arrest. **Officer Karl Willers arrived to assist.** The officers searched the area where Herplinck had been sitting, and discovered drug paraphernalia and a baggie containing what appeared to be methamphetamine. As the search continued, more items of drug paraphernalia and suspected narcotics in the vehicle. The driver,

Heather Anderson-Larscheid, 38, was also placed under arrest. At the Jail, correctional deputies found additional narcotics hidden in her underwear. On Tuesday, February 6th, **Officer Keith Voegel** observed several persons arguing outside of a parked vehicle. He stopped to investigate and identified two as Anderson-Larscheid and Zachery Bongers, 25. Ofc. Voegel discovered that Bongers was the subject of a Scott County warrant, and placed him under arrest. Ofc. Voegel discovered two syringes in his sweatshirt. **Officers Mike Thul and Matt Shuda** arrived to assist. Knowing that Anderson-Larscheid had just been arrested for narcotics, Ofc. Thul and **K9 Chase** performed a sniff of the vehicle, and K9 Chase

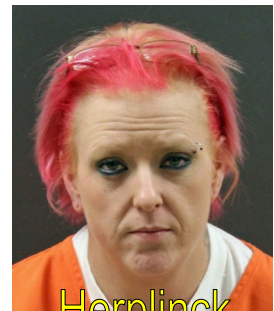
alerted to several areas of the vehicle. The officers searched the vehicle and a backpack, discovering a syringe containing a liquid and suspected methamphetamine. The backpack contained Anderson-Larscheid's belongings. She was again arrested and jailed. Anderson-Larscheid was charged with 5th degree Controlled Substances, Possession of Hypodermic Needles and Introducing Contraband Into Jail from the first case, and 5th degree Controlled Substances and Possession of Hypodermic Needles in the second case. Her combined bail was set at \$5,000 with Conditions. Bongers, jailed in Scott County, was charged with Possession of Hypodermic Needles. Herplinck, jailed in Steele County, was charged with Theft.
