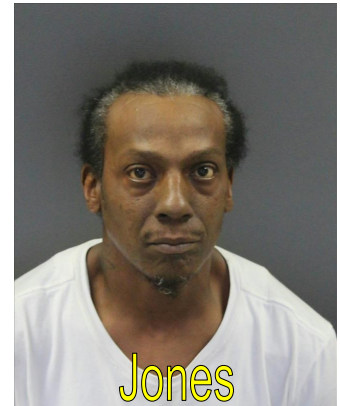

On Friday, May 18th, **Detectives Matt Kolling and Josh Alexander** stopped to interview a person who had passed a counterfeit \$100 bill. While speaking with the man, Det. Kolling could smell a strong odor of fresh marijuana coming from the man. The suspect admitted he both smoked and sold marijuana, and thought he got the counterfeit \$100 bill from a person he had sold marijuana to. When asked if he had

any marijuana on him, he produced five baggies of marijuana from his pants pocket which appeared to be packaged for sale. Det. Kolling asked if he had any more, and the suspect produced five more baggies from another pocket. The suspect, Walter Jones, 47, was arrested and charged with 5th degree Controlled Substances. His bail was set at \$15,000 with conditions.



On Wednesday, **Sergeant Matt Knutson** and **Chief Andy Bohlen**, along with Faribault students, **Kathy Cooper** from Rice County Safe Roads Coalition, **Josh Ramaker** from Rice County Public Health, Teacher **Brian Coleman** and several FHS students met with the assistance of dedicated crew from the **Rice County Highway Department** to paint Buckle Up logos on school exits in Faribault and Northfield. It was a good reminder to all students to buckle up as they

exit parking lots onto public roadways. It is estimated that 25% of motor vehicle crashes involving serious injury and

death in Rice County over the past five years were due directly to being unbelted. Law enforcement wants everyone safe and reminds them all to "Buckle Up".

Our officers, along with others throughout Rice County, are conducting enhanced seatbelt enforcement for the Toward Zero Deaths Click It or Ticket nationwide campaign. A goal of the campaign is to help educate motorists about the benefits of seatbelt usage and reduce injuries. The campaign continues through June 3rd.

Fortunately, most Minnesotans are making the life-saving decision to buckle up. - According to the 2017 Minnesota Seat Belt Survey, 92 percent of front seat occupants are wearing their seat belts. - Severe injuries are also going down. In 1987, there were 4,176 vehicle occupants who suffered severe injuries in traffic crashes. That number dropped to 1,317 in 2016.

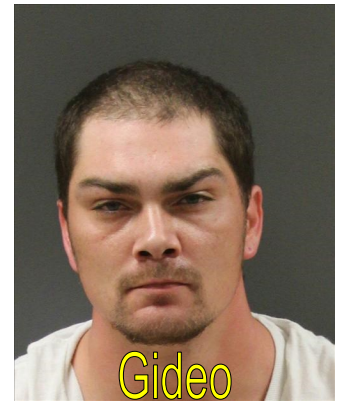
Warrant Watch
