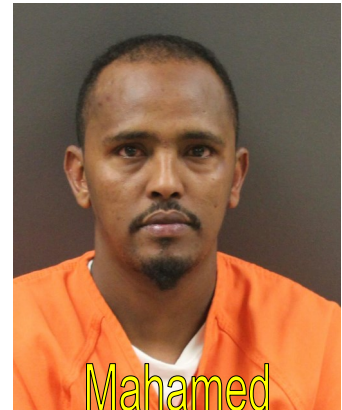

Assault Arrest

On Saturday, June 30th, **Officers Sarah Tollefson, Mike Thul, Mallory House, Scott Duncan, John Pesta, Sean Smallen** and **Sergeant Eric Sammon** responded to a reported assault. The caller stated two males were involved, and one of the males had a knife. On their arrival, officers saw one male on top of the other, and was punching and strangling the other. The suspect was verbally commanded to stop and complied, but became physically non-compliant with officers as they tried to handcuff him. A Taser was used to gain compliance from the suspect. Officers found a large kitchen

knife on the floor, and saw blood on the floor and walls. The victim was given aid until he could be transported to the hospital, where he was treated for several cuts. In a follow-up interview, a witness told officers the suspect was holding a knife while approaching the victim from behind. **Detectives Josh Alexander, Matt Shuda** and **Sergeant Matt Long** also assisted with the investigation. The suspect, Bishar Mahamed, 27, was jailed and charged with 2nd degree Assault (two counts). His bail was set at \$150,000 with conditions.
