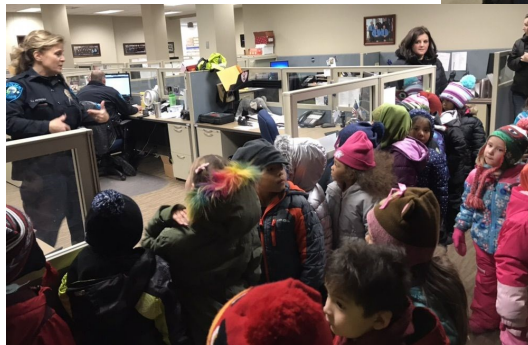

Students Tour PD

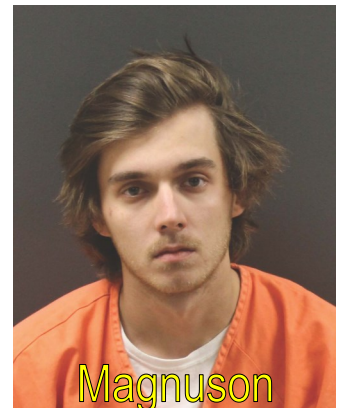

Road Trip

On Thursday, November 22nd, **Officer Adam Marvin** stopped a vehicle for a littering violation. As he spoke with the driver, he could smell a strong odor of marijuana coming from the vehicle. **Officers John Pesta, Sarah Tollefson, Sean Smallen** and **RCSO Sergeant Trevor Peterson** arrived to assist. In searching the vehicle, a total of 2.8 pounds of marijuana was recovered. Ofc. Marvin also recovered 60 vaping cartridges containing THC, 21 packets of THC-extract powder, marijuana

wax, 26 amphetamine pills, and paraphernalia used for drug sales. The packaging indicated the marijuana had been purchased in Colorado. The driver, Matthew Magnuson, 20, was arrested. Three passengers were released from the scene, and one will be formally charged at a later date. Magnuson was charged with 5th degree Controlled Substances-Sales (two counts) and 5th degree Controlled Substances-Possession. His bail was set at \$5,000 with conditions.

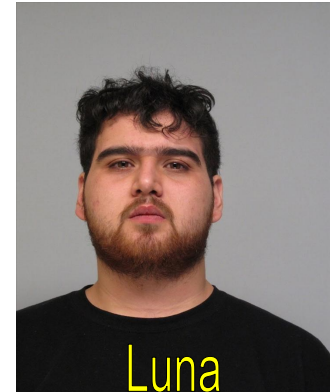

Warrant Arrest
