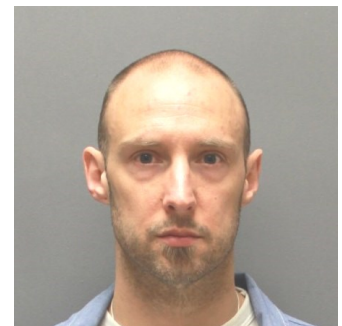

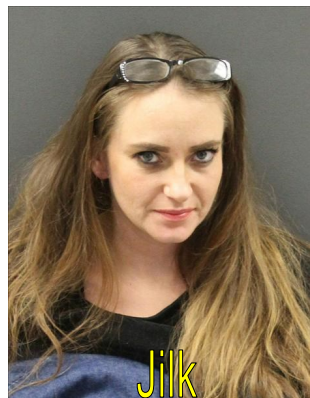
Officer Recognized

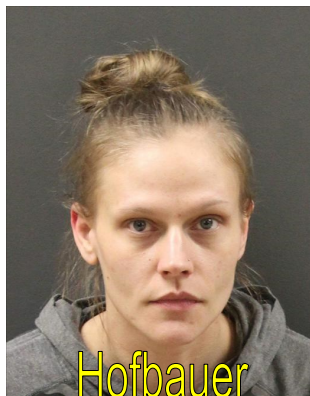


We Have Pictures, You Know

On Sunday, December 9th, **Officers Jacob Holm and Chris Tonjum** responded to a reported shoplifting. Store personnel had provided officers with a description of the suspects. The officers found the suspects nearby and stopped to identify them. The female did not have an ID and provided a name. Officer Tonjum checked the name and saw that the driver's license photo did not match. The female admitted the name was her sister's, and provided her correct name, Rebekah Jilk, 33. She was arrested on several arrest warrants, as well as charged with Giving a Peace Officer a False Name.



On Wednesday, December 12th, a tipster called dispatch to report the whereabouts of Lekeisha Hofbauer, 31, who was the subject of four arrest warrants. **Officers Josh Sjodin, Mike Thul, Karl**



Willers and Kara Christensen responded to a local store where the tipster had seen Hofbauer. When she was located and stopped, she denied being Hofbauer and provided a different name. The officers were quickly able to determine the name was phony, and Ofc. Willers was able to confirm she was indeed Hofbauer. She was taken into custody without incident. Prior to being searched, she told officers she was in possession of a hypodermic needle as well as a baggie of methamphetamine. The needle and two baggies containing approximately seven grams of methamphetamine were recovered, and no further contraband was located. Hofbauer was jailed and charged with 5th degree Controlled Substances and Giving a Peace Officer a False Name. Bail was set at \$15,000 with conditions.
