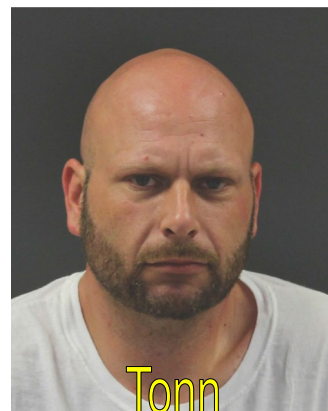

Domestic Assault Arrest

On Saturday, June 29th, **Officers Luke Fridstrom, Karl Willers, Jacob Holm, Sean Smallen, Adam Marvin and Sergeant Brandon Gliem** responded to a reported domestic. When they arrived, the victim met the officers outside of the residence. She reported the suspect was intoxicated and had made numerous threats to kill her and burn the house down. The suspect was locked inside of the residence.



After several attempts to speak with the suspect and obtain his cooperation, the door was forced open and the suspect was warned **K9 Cannon** would be released. The suspect, **Jeremie Roe, 39**, then surrendered without further incident. He was arrested and charged with Domestic Assault and Terroristic Threats. His bail was set at \$1,000 with conditions.

Our Toward Zero Deaths (TZD) speed enforcement wave is underway. Officers, deputies, and troopers statewide are conducting enhanced enforcement directed toward speed violations. They are also on the lookout for other unsafe driving behaviors. The wave continues through July 21.

DWI Arrest

On Sunday, June 30th, **Officer Sean Smallen** was flagged down by a motorist who reported another vehicle appeared to have front end damage and was dragging debris. Ofc. Smallen caught up to the car, which stopped immediately and the driver exited. Ofc. Smallen noted the vehicle was dragging pine tree debris. The driver, **Nolan Warwick, 19**, appeared intoxicated and told Ofc. Smallen that he'd “had



plenty” to drink. Ofc. Smallen administered field sobriety tests, which further indicated Warwick was intoxicated. Warwick was arrested and transported to the jail. He refused to provide a breath sample. Warwick was charged with 2nd degree DWI and Refusal to Test. He was released on his own recognizance by the court.
