Domestic Assault Arrest

On Tuesday, September 24th, **Officers Spencer Angle, Sean Smallen, Tony Kuchinka, Sarah Tollefson and Sergeant Matt Knutson** responded to a reported domestic assault. The victim reported he had been arguing with the suspect, his mother's boyfriend, when the suspect grabbed him by the head and threw him into a fence. Officer could see marks on the victim's neck. The suspect told officers that the victim had rushed him

and he was defending himself, however witness accounts conflicted with his statement. The suspect, Michael Barta, 45, was arrested without incident. He was charged with Domestic Assault - Felony (two counts), and his bail was set at \$12,000 with conditions.



Our officers will be conducting extra patrols for the current TZD enforcement wave. Officers, deputies and troopers statewide will be on the lookout for seatbelt violations. Although Minnesota drivers have a 93% compliance rate, increased seatbelt and child car seat usage would further decrease serious injuries and deaths. The current

enforcement wave will be conducted through September 28th.



Fire Found

At just after 2 am on Thursday, September 24th, **Officer Spencer Angle** spotted a fire on top of the new addition to the Rice County Government Services Building. Faribault Fire arrived and extinguished the fire, which was limited to an air conditioning unit. Thanks to Ofc. Angle's sharp eyes, the fire was quickly addressed and the damage was limited.

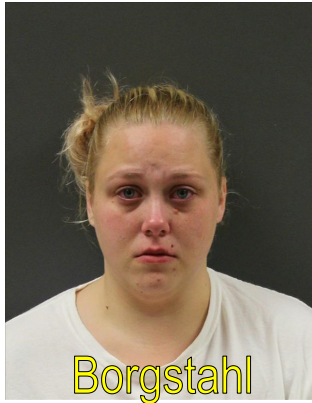

Domestic Assault Arrest

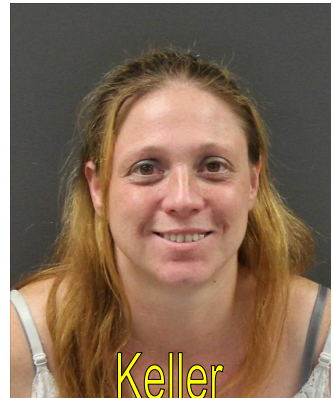
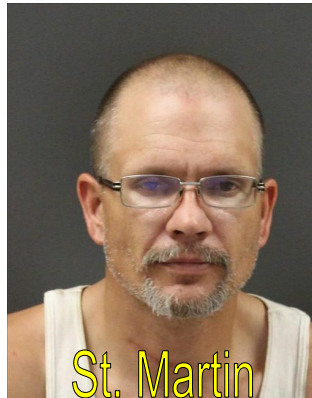
Officer Michael Shuda and **Sergeant Brandon Gliem** responded to a reported domestic assault on Wednesday, September 25th. The caller told officers that the two residents had been arguing and the victim was trying to pack his belongings to leave. The caller also stated the suspect, **Shianne Borgstahl**, 24, struck her and punched the victim several times. The victim and another



witness reported the suspect was swinging her arms and hitting the victim in the head. Borgstahl was arrested and charged with Domestic Assault and was released on her own recognizance by the court.

Stolen Vehicle Recovered

On Sunday, September 22nd, **Officer Tony Larson** performed a license check on a vehicle and was informed that the vehicle had been reported stolen. He called for assistance and stopped the vehicle when it turned in a driveway. **Officers Jacob Holm, Chris Tonjum, Ben Borash, Sergeants Matt Knutson, Eric Sammon** and **RCSO Deputy John Pesta** arrived to assist. The occupants of the vehicle, **Trevor St. Martin**, 40, and **Deanna Keller**, 33, were taken into custody without incident. St. Martin told officers that his vehicle had broken down and a



friend had offered the use of this vehicle. Officers noted that the steering column was broken. Both St. Martin and

Keller were each charged with Receiving Stolen Property and released on their own recognizance by the court.

Threat Response

On Monday, September 23rd, **Officers Keith Voegel, Ben Borash, Chris Tonjum, Detectives John Gramling, Ben Johns, Brittany Carstensen, Sergeants Eric Sammon, Matt Knutson**, and **RCSO Deputies Tony Malepsy, Derek Estrem, Investigators Jason Witt, Nate Hanson, Dan Belcourt, Sergeants Justin Hunt, Paul LaRoche** and **Nathan Budin** responded to the Alexander Learning Academy. Staff reported that a 16-

year-old male student had made threats towards staff members before leaving campus. Staff further reported that the student returned a short time later, continuing to make threats and gesturing as if he had a concealed weapon. The school went into a lock-down and staff called 911.

Officers arrived within minutes and took the suspect into custody without incident. No weapon was found. Officers also searched the school and

grounds to ensure no weapon had been discarded, and no weapons were found. No staff or students were injured during the incident. Officers cleared the school to ensure no further threats, and the school resumed normal operations.

The suspect was transported to the Dakota County Juvenile Detention Center. He was later released to his parents pending formal charges.
