## Snow Emergency Notification

With the first few flakes of winter already fallen, it's time to revisit parking, snow emergencies, and notifications.

**15-44:** *No person shall park or leave standing unattended any vehicle upon any street between November 1 and April 1, between the hours of 1:00 a.m. and 8:00 a.m. when a snow emergency has been declared, and before the street has been plowed curb to curb, whichever occurs later.*

Snow emergencies are generally declared after a significant snowfall. Some storms may require a two-day snow emergency to properly clear streets. Snow emergency notifications are made utilizing the following resources:

Residents are encouraged to enroll with **Everbridge** by visiting the "emergency notifications" tab on the police department website. Residents already enrolled in Everbridge are asked to log on to their account, review their information and personalize their notifications. Snow emergencies will be sent under the "Rice County Alerts".

Residents may also enroll in **Notify Me®** for email only alerts. Visit the city website and click on the Notify Me icon. Supply your email address and click on the alerts you wish to receive. *The text option is not available at this time.*

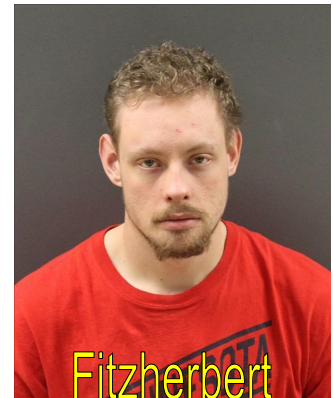

## Domestic Assault Arrest

On Saturday, November 9th, **Officers Michael Shuda, Sarah Tollefson, Josh Alexander, Matt Shuda** and **Sergeant Matt Knutson** responded to a reported disturbance. At the scene, the female victim reported that her former boyfriend, Michael Fitzherbert, 21, had been at the residence, and she had an Order for Protection barring him from contacting her. She further reported that Fitzherbert’s current girlfriend had come to the residence to pick up his

child, but then he approached and began to yell, push and threaten her. She took her son and fled the scene. When a witness tried to intervene, Fitzherbert grabbed a pipe and threatened the witness before leaving the scene. A short time later, Fitzherbert was found at a local store and arrested. He was charged with 2nd degree Assault, Domestic Assault - felony, and Violation of an Order for Protection (two counts). His bail was set at \$20,000 with conditions.

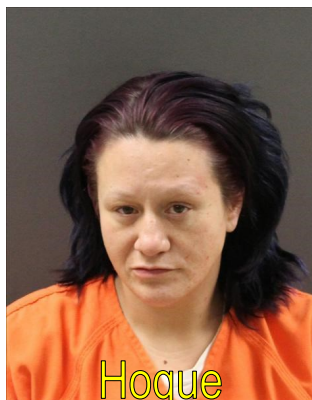

## Drug Arrest

On Tuesday, November 12th, **Officer Michael Shuda** stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation. He identified the driver as Angela Hoque, 34, and discovered that her drivers license was “revoked”. She was also unable to provide insurance information. **Officers Adam Marvin** and **Kara Christensen** arrived to assist. Hoque was searched, and a methamphetamine pipe and



two baggies containing suspected methamphetamine were found on her person. She was arrested and charged with 5th degree Controlled Substances, Driving After Revocation, and No Proof of Insurance. Her bail was set at \$2,500 with conditions.
