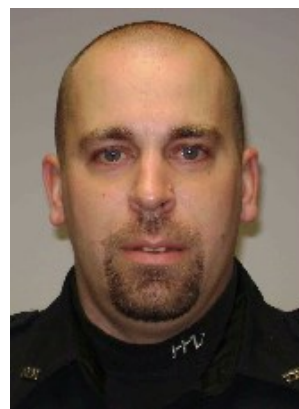
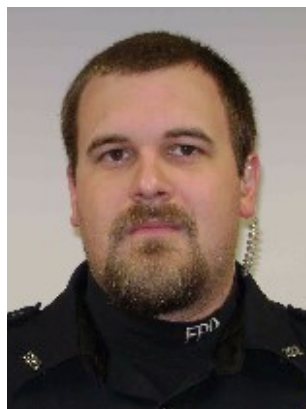


## Change of Assignments

## DANCO Arrest

On Friday, December 27th, **Officer Scott Duncan** responded to a reported Domestic abuse No Contact Order (DANCO) violation. The caller reported that the suspect, Francisco Davila-Garcia, 35, was following her sister around town and had texted her, all in violation of the DANCO. After taking their report, **Officers Bill Considine** and **Matt Shuda** assisted Ofc. Duncan in

locating Davila-Garcia at his residence. He denied trying to contact the victim. He was arrested and charged with Stalking and DANCO Violation, and his bail was set at \$100,000 with conditions.

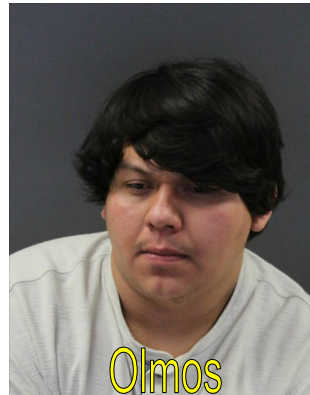
Davila-Garcia was sentenced on December 31 in two previous cases from earlier this year to 86 months in prison.

## New Years No-no

On Wednesday, January 1st, **Officer Josh Sjodin** and **Detective DJ Skluzacek** responded to a vehicle off the road and a possible intoxicated driver. On their arrival, Ofc. Sjodin met with a man whom witnesses identified as the driver, and was identified as Antonio Olmos, 24. Olmos displayed signs of intoxication, and Ofc. Sjodin administered field sobriety tests. Olmos was ar-



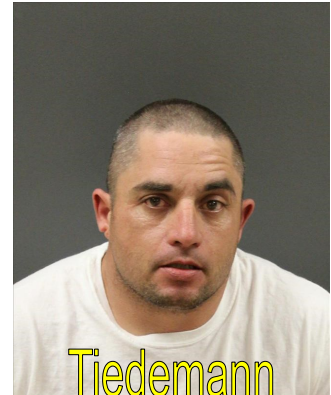

rested, and while being searched, Ofc. Sjodin discovered a small baggie of suspected cocaine. He was transported to the jail. Olmos refused to submit to a breath test. He was charged with 5th degree Controlled Substances and Refusal to Test. His bail was set at \$3,000 with conditions.

## Drug Arrest

On Tuesday, December 31st, **Officer Adam Marvin** saw a vehicle which appeared to be travelling faster than the posted speed limit. He caught up to the vehicle, and noted several equipment violations displayed by the vehicle. He stopped the vehicle and met with the driver, Larry Tiedemann, 39. He admitted he did not have insurance on the vehicle. Ofc. Marvin checked Tiedemann’s drivers license, and found his driving privileges were “revoked”. **Officer Matt Shuda** arrived to assist. Tiedemann admitted

to having “weed”, and turned over a small baggie of marijuana. Inside the vehicle, Ofc. Marvin found a small baggie of powder, suspected to be methamphetamine. Tiedemann was arrested, and Ofc. Shuda found another baggie of suspected methamphetamine in his pocket. In total, officers recovered 3.25 grams of methamphetamine. Tiedemann was charged with 5th degree Controlled Substances, and was released on his own recognizance by the court.
